OUTCOME OF CURRICULUM- Clinical competency framework.The 7-Star Doctor Framework

To graduate and become a doctor, nurse, or health professional, the University of Health Sciences doesn't just check if you can pass a written exam. They check who you are as a whole person. Instead of just memorizing textbooks, you are trained and tested on the "KAS" formula: Knowledge, Attitude, and Skills. You are trained and tested to master seven completely different roles. Think of it as earning seven distinct stars before you can earn your degree:

Star 1: The Care Provider- This is your core clinical role. You must view patients holistically not just as a disease or a bed number.

Star 2: The Decision Maker- Medical situations move fast, and treatments cost money. You cannot be indecisive. You must choose the safest, most effective, and most cost-effective treatment for your patient.

Star 3: The Communicator-Medicine is useless if you cannot talk to the person you are trying to heal. You act as a bridge. You listen patiently to complaints, explain complicated sicknesses in simple Urdu/local language without using scary medical jargon, counsel grieving families gently, and take proper informed consent before procedures.

Star 4: The Community Leader-A doctor's responsibility doesn't stop at the hospital gates. You are a role model in society. You inspire trust and lead your community to adopt healthier lifestyles. You understand the unique local health challenges (like dengue outbreaks, clean water issues, or maternal health) and steps needed to fix them.

Star 5: The Manager- Healthcare relies heavily on teamwork, administration, and resource management. You know how to run a clinic or a hospital ward smoothly. You handle trivial-looking but vital tasks like managing patient records, delegating duties, working with multidisciplinary teams (nurses, pharmacists, lab staff), and making sure clinical data is shared accurately.

Star 6: The Researcher- New viruses and diseases emerge constantly, and medical science changes daily. You don't just rely blindly on what was written in old textbooks. You know how to think critically, look up fresh medical research,

analyze data, and figure out how to solve new health problems using evidence-based science.

Star 7: The Lifelong Learner- Your education does not end on graduation day. UHS uses Self-Directed Learning (SDL) to teach you *how* to study on your own. This star ensures that for the next 30 to 40 years of your career, you will stay committed to constantly upgrading your medical skills and knowledge.

ASSESSMENT- UHS checks if you have earned these stars using a transparent, blueprinted system:

For your Knowledge (Stars 1, 2, & 6): Tested via MCQs & SEQs that give you real-world, clinical patient scenarios instead of simple definition questions.

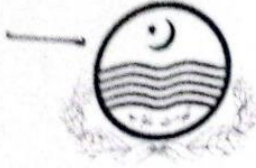
For your Skills & Manners (Stars 1, 3, & 5): Tested via OSCE & OSPE practical exams. You move through timed stations where you are scored on how well you perform procedures, interact with patient actors, and behave professionally.

For your Real-world Practice (Stars 5 & 7): Logged inside your mandatory Clinical Portfolios and Logbooks, where senior supervisors sign off on your day-to-day progress in the hospital wards.

GUIDELINES FOR STUDENT ELECTIVES IN MEDICAL AND DENTAL COLLEGES (UHS CONSTITUENT & AFFILIATED INSTITUTIONS)

In continuation of the University's mandate to ensure standardized, competency-based medical and dental education, and with the approval of the Competent Authority, the following Guidelines for Student Electives are hereby notified for implementation across all constituent and affiliated institutions.

1. PURPOSE:

Electives are structured academic activities designed to:

- i. Enhance clinical, research, and community health competencies
- ii. Provide national and international exposure
- iii. Promote self-directed learning and career orientation
- iv. Strengthen professionalism and ethical conduct

2. SCOPE:

This policy applies to:

- i. MBBS students (Year 4 and Year 5)
- ii. BDS students (Year 3 and Year 4)

Electives may be undertaken in:

- i. Recognized local institutions
- ii. Approved international universities/hospitals
- iii. Research and public health organizations

3. DURATION & TIMING:

- i. Duration: 2-4 weeks
- ii. To be completed during:
 - Summer/Winter vacations
- iii. Shall not interfere with:
 - Academic schedule
 - Examinations or assessments

4. TYPES OF ELECTIVES:

- i. Clinical Electives (specialty rotations)
- ii. Research Electives (laboratory/clinical research)
- iii. Community/Public Health Electives
- iv. International Electives / Observerships

5. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

Students must:

- i. Pass all previous professional examinations
- ii. Maintain $\geq 75\%$ attendance
- iii. Have satisfactory disciplinary record
- iv. Obtain approval from host institution and NOC from parent institution

6. SOURCING, FUNDING & INSTITUTIONAL FACILITATION (CORE CLAUSE):

6.1 Student-Initiated Electives (Primary Pathway):

Students are strongly encouraged to independently identify and apply for elective opportunities offered by:

- i. National and international universities and hospitals
- ii. Research institutions and laboratories
- iii. Public health organizations and NGOs
- iv. Donor agencies and global health programs

This approach promotes:

- i. Self-directed learning
- ii. Professional networking
- iii. Global academic exposure

6.2 Financial Responsibility:

Electives are primarily self-financed, including:

- i. Travel and accommodation
- ii. Application/placement fees
- iii. Visa and insurance (if applicable)

Students may avail:

UHS Affiliated colleges may establish MoUs with national and international institutions.

Benefits may include:

- ii. Fee waivers or subsidized opportunities
- iii. Structured rotations

6.5 UHS Exchange Programs

UHS may offer formal student exchange programs, including:

- i. Reciprocal academic exchanges
- ii. Clinical observerships
- iii. Research electives

Selection shall be:

- i. Merit-based
- ii. Transparent and competitive

6.6 Equity Consideration

Institutions shall:

- i. Encourage participation of academically deserving students

Policy On Non-Charging Of Students For Clinical Training Activities And Materials

- 1. Policy Title:** Policy for Non-Charging of Students for Clinical Work, Procedures, and Training Materials during Clinical Rotations and Studentship
- 2. Purpose:** The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all students undergoing clinical education, clerkships, rotations, practical training, and studentship within the institution are provided equal learning opportunities without being charged for clinical work, procedures, or materials necessarily used for educational and training purposes. This policy is developed in compliance with standards and expectations of the Pakistan Medical and Dental Council regarding student welfare, ethical training practices, and institutional responsibility.
- 3. Scope:** This policy applies to:

All undergraduate and postgraduate students, Clinical departments and teaching units, Faculty members and supervisors, Affiliated teaching hospitals, Administrative and finance departments, Clinical laboratories and skill laboratories
- 4. Policy Statement:** The College strictly prohibits charging students for:

1. Clinical procedures performed under close supervision as part of approved training activities.
2. Use of routine consumable materials required for educational purposes.
3. Participation in ward rotations, OPD observations, theatre attendance, laboratory demonstrations, or bedside teaching.
4. Access to institutional patients for educational learning under supervision.
5. Mandatory clinical logbook activities approved by the department.
6. Essential materials utilized during structured teaching and training sessions.

No faculty member, department, hospital staff member, or administrative office shall directly or indirectly demand payment from students for educational clinical exposure or training-related procedures conducted under the approved curriculum.

5. Institutional Responsibilities: The institution, through administrative offices and Head of Departments, shall:


1. Allocate budgetary provisions for educational consumables and teaching materials.
2. Ensure availability of essential clinical and laboratory materials required for student learning.
3. Facilitate equitable access to clinical learning opportunities.

4. Monitor departments for compliance with this policy.
5. Address complaints related to unauthorized charges promptly and transparently.

6. Complaint and Reporting Mechanism: Students may report violations of this policy to Head of Department/ Director Student Affairs. All complaints shall be handled confidentially and without retaliation.

7. Monitoring and Compliance

The Medical Education Department and Administration shall periodically review implementation of this policy during departmental audits and PMDC compliance reviews. Non-compliance by any department or staff member may result in administrative action as per institutional rules.

POLICY FOR PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELLING

1. **Introduction.** Psychological counseling also known as talking therapy is a collaborative space to explore one's difficulties in a safe and confidential setting. Sometimes medical students feel over burdened, overwhelmed, over enthusiastic, depressed, and un able to cope with the studies in changed environment being away from home. In such circumstances a psychological counselor can provide a supportive non-judgmental environment where they may feel more at ease to talk openly about his /her problems. Thus psychological counseling is a very good tool to mitigate stress and strain among students and can bring them to mainstream.

2. **Objectives.** To provide a supportive non-judgmental environment where the student may feel charmed to talk openly about his problems so as the counselor be able to redress his/her issues regarding:

- a. Studies (decision making, exam anxiety, fear of authority)
- b. Relationship and partner conflicts, problems finding partners.
- c. Isolation and social phobias.
- d. Separation from parents, new orientation.
- e. Depression, anxiety, self-harming behavior, suicidal tendencies, psycho somatic ailments, eating disorders, compulsive disorders.
- f. Addictions (e.g. drugs, gambling, computer or internet addictions)
- g. Integration of international students
- h. Any other issue.

3. **Implementation of the Policy:** The policy will be implemented by the Counselors. Following is the composition of the committee:-

- a. **President:**
 - Psychologist at Affiliated hospitals of GMC
- b. **Members:**
 - Two senior faculty members of GMC

4. **Responsibilities of the Counselors.** All the students of Gujranwala Medical College and their parents / guardians will have access to any of the counselors for counseling services. The responsibility of the counselors will be to:-

- a. Listen, encourage and empathize with the students to see their issues

- more clearly or in a different perspective.
- b. Help the students to understand themselves better and find their own solutions to resolve or cope with their situations.
 - c. Provide enabling environment to solve the problems.
 - d. Be pivotal to empower them to unleash their hidden potentials and capabilities.
 - e. Have an open door policy during the office hours. However they will be available round the clock in circumstances of need.
 - f. Maintain complete confidentiality except under extraordinary circumstances like self-mutilating behavior, suicidal tendencies and threat to life and property.
 - g. Ensure availability and easy access of mental health professionals when so needed.

POLICY FOR FAIR AND FORMAL STUDENT GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES

Purpose: This policy outlines a fair and formal process to address student grievances and concerns that may affect the status or standing of students at Gujranwala Medical College. The aim is to ensure a transparent and just procedure for addressing issues that impact students' positions or rights within the institution. Policy is approved in 122th academic council meeting held on 22nd March 2025.

- 1. Definition of Grievances:** a. A grievance is defined as any formal complaint, concern, or dispute brought forward by a student regarding an action or decision that affects their status within Gujranwala Medical College.

- 2. Scope of Grievances:** a. Grievances may include, but are not limited to, academic matters, disciplinary actions, discrimination, status changes, or other issues affecting the student's rights within the institution.

- 3. Grievance Resolution:** Students are encouraged to resolve grievances informally by discussing concerns with the relevant faculty, staff, or administration in the first instance.

- 4. Formal Grievance Procedure:**
 - a. If the grievance remains unresolved informally, a formal procedure will be followed.
 - b. The student must submit a written grievance to a designated office or committee responsible for handling grievances.
 - c. The written grievance should include details such as the nature of the complaint, any relevant supporting documentation, and the desired resolution.

Review and Investigation:

- a. Upon receipt of the formal grievance, an impartial committee or designated authority will conduct an investigation into the matter.
- b. The committee will review all available evidence and may request additional information from both the student and the involved parties.

i. Hearing or Mediation:

If necessary, a hearing or mediation session may be arranged to allow the student to present their case and allow for a resolution discussion before disciplinary committee, if needed.

7. Decision and Resolution:

- a. Following the investigation and any hearing, the committee responsible for grievances will provide a written decision detailing the resolution and the reasons for their decision.
- b. If the grievance is found to be substantiated, the committee will outline the steps for rectification or further actions to be taken.

8. Appeals Process:

- a. Students dissatisfied with the decision or resolution may have the right to appeal, following a predefined appeals process.
- b. Appeals will be considered by a separate appellate body or higher authority, ensuring an independent review of the grievance resolution.

9. Confidentiality and Record-Keeping:

All information and proceedings related to the grievance will be kept confidential, with records maintained for the purposes of accountability and future reference.

10. Timely Resolutions:

Efforts will be made to resolve grievances in a timely manner, and students will be updated on the progress of their grievance at each stage.

This policy ensures that students have a fair, formal, and transparent process to address grievances that may impact their status within Gujranwala Medical College. It aims to resolve issues in a just and timely manner while upholding the rights and welfare of the students.

STUDENT HEALTH POLICY

1. Purpose and Scope

The purpose of this policy is to ensure the physical and mental well-being of all undergraduate medical students enrolled at Gujranwala Medical College (GMC). This policy outlines the health facilities, preventive care, and emergency services available to students through GMC and its affiliated teaching hospitals.

2. General Health & Outpatient Services (OPD)

GMC is committed to providing accessible basic healthcare for all its enrolled students.

- **Free Consultation:** Students presenting their valid GMC ID card are entitled to free medical consultations with institutional medical officers and consultants.
- **Basic Diagnostics and Medications:** Basic laboratory investigations and essential medicines available within the hospital pharmacy will be provided to the students free of charge.
- Immediate, 24/7 access to the hospital's Emergency Department is guaranteed for any student experiencing a needle stick injury or accidental exposure to infectious fluids.

3. Emergency & Inpatient Care (Hospitalization)



- **24/7 Emergency Care:** Students requiring urgent medical attention have prioritized, free-of-cost access to the Emergency Department of the GMC-affiliated teaching hospital at all times.
- **Inpatient Admission:** In the event that a student requires hospitalization, a dedicated bed or priority admission in the hospital's private/semi-private ward (subject to availability) will be provided.
- **Cost Exemption:** Bed charges and procedural fees for admitted students will be waived. However, expensive specialized implants or out-of-formulary medicines may need to be borne by the student.

4. Student Leaves and Medical Certification

- **Medical Leave Policy:** If a student is unwell and unable to attend classes or clinical duties, they must notify the Student section.
- **Medical Certificates:** For sick leaves exceeding three days, a medical certificate issued or countersigned by a designated Assistant professor or Consultant at the GMC-affiliated hospital is required.
- **Fitness to Return:** Following a prolonged illness or contagious disease (e.g., Tuberculosis, severe COVID-19, etc.), the student must obtain a "Fitness to Return" certificate from the hospital to ensure the safety of peers and patients.

5. Responsibilities of the Student

- **Health Declarations:** Students must honestly disclose any pre-existing medical conditions or allergies at the time of admission to ensure appropriate care in emergencies.
- **Adherence to Safety Protocols:** Students must strictly follow all Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) guidelines, utilize provided Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) during clinical rotations, and immediately report any clinical accidents (like NSI) to their supervisor.
- **Access to medical record of the medical student:** Only authorized person from student section or a faculty member can access medical record to verify the health needs.
